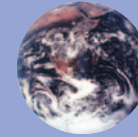
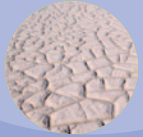

As a Constituent Body of the Society for the Environment (SocEnv), the IEMA is able to award the Chartered Environmentalist qualification.

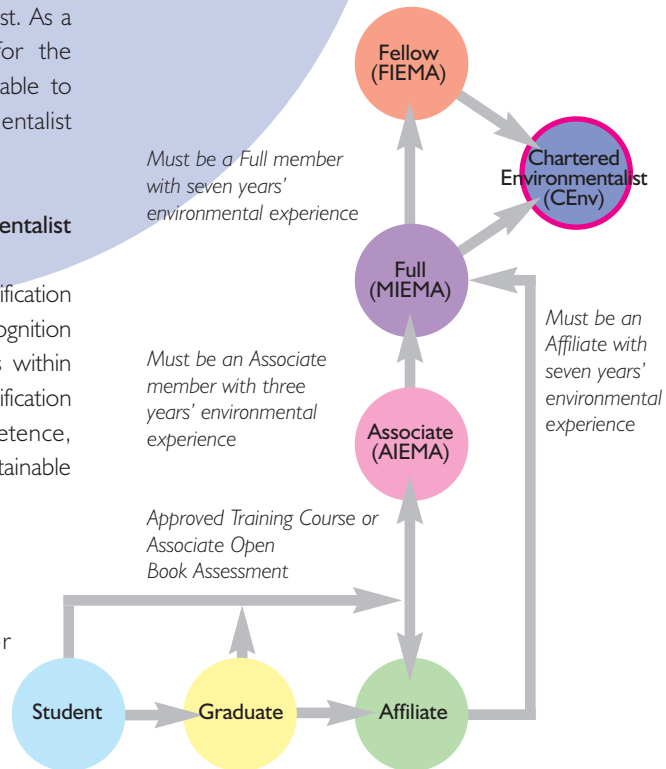
What is the Chartered Environmentalist Qualification?

The Chartered Environmentalist qualification is the highest level of professional recognition that can be achieved by practitioners within the environmental sector. This qualification recognises an individual's competence, knowledge and engagement in sustainable environmental management and development.

Who can apply?

To be eligible to apply for Chartered Environmentalist status, a candidate must be a Full or Fellow member of the IEMA. Affiliate

and Associate members of the IEMA can undertake a combined assessment for Full membership and Chartered Environmentalist. Successful candidates must be able to demonstrate substantial knowledge, understanding, engagement and competence in sustainable environmental management and development.



How to apply?

There is a three stage process to apply for the Chartered Environmentalist qualification. An initial assessment form is submitted to check eligibility. If a candidate is eligible to apply they are then required to submit a portfolio of evidence, which is assessed by an external panel. The final stage of the application process is the Professional Review Interview, which is held by two Chartered Environmentalist Assessors. In order to attain the qualification, the candidate must pass all three stages.
