








Background


- COVID 19 has posed new and unique challenges to project sponsors, consultants and lenders.

0. Introduction – Category B projects



EBRD 2019 Environmental and Social Policy: definition of Category B projects

- "Classic approach": in-house or external E&S appraisal with site visit when necessary – preparation of an ESAP (Environmental and Social Action Plan)
- ➤ Bulk of EBRD projects are CatB: 86% of active projects
- ➤ EBRD Covid19 travel restrictions: no travel at all, then travel possible for local consultants subject to TRA approval
- 3 case studies with different contexts E&S appraisal (due diligence) ongoing



1. Case study #1: Energy/Tajikistan



- > Transaction: energy distribution 7 sites
- Client: existing client, E&S practices well-known by EBRD
- Covid19 travel restrictions for consultant: no international travel no local travel (multi-sites with intense travelling and health condition of the consultant team: increased risk)
- E&S appraisal approach:
 - Appointment of the consultant who did E&S appraisal of previous transaction (similar scope, same client)
 - 100% remote work: use of a first questionnaire to identify risks (in English and Russian), second questionnaire tailor-made based on first questionnaire findings, conference calls, instructions to client to take on-site pictures based on precise specifications
 - Specific questions related to Covid19

1. Case study #1: Energy/Tajikistan



- Lessons learnt:
- Pictures of reasonably good quality, which overall allowed meeting the objective to identify site-specific issues to be improved in the context of the Project (but pictures more "useful" than others)
- Provide very clear instructions on visual information needed
- Key success factor: consultant already familiar with the client





2. Case study #2: Mining/Albania



- > Transaction: Natural Resources 3 sites
- Client: new client
- Covid19 travel restrictions for consultant: no international travel local travel possible
- E&S appraisal approach:
 - Appointment of a consultant with a mixed team (international and Albanian)
 - 3 local specialists (Env, Soc, H&S) visited the sites with remote support from international team
 - Day 1: client's management interview in HQ (local team) and VC (intl. team)
 - Day 2: Sites 1 and 2 with poor WiFi connection: intl. team could not have real-time interactions with the local team during the visit, but questions agreed with the intl. team in advance (instructions)+ pictures/videos taken
 - Day 3: Site 3 with good WiFi connection: real-time connection (via mobile phone) with the intl. team

2. Case study #2: Mining/Albania



- Lessons learnt:
- Approach subject to WiFi connection available on site
- Key success factors: i) technically robust local team, ii) local and international specialists in consultant's team used to work together





3. Case study #3: Manufacturing/Morocco



- > Transaction: Heavy industry 1 site
- Client: new client affiliate of a major Group certifications (ISO 9001, ISO 14001, OHSAS 18001, FSSC 22000)
- Covid19 travel restrictions for consultant: no international travel local travel possible
- E&S appraisal approach:
 - Appointment of an intl. consultant with experience in the industry (local consultants not always familiar with EBRD PRs)
 - E&S appraisal in two phases:
 - Phase 1 = 100% remote appraisal (desktop review of existing documentation + client's interview) with preparation of ESAP v1
 - Phase 2= visit of facilities (as soon as possible) and preparation of ESAP v2

3. Case study #3: Manufacturing/Morocco



- Key success factors
 - Strong Consultant's experience in the sector
 - Detailed documentation available from Client for Phase 1 appraisal (EIA, policies/procedures/manuals, GRI reports, etc.)
 - ESAP revision to be captured in the Loan Agreement

4. Key takeaways



- Essential to continue business with no relaxation of EBRD ESP and Performance Requirements (PR) in these 3 case studies, we were able to take the projects forward because we obtained information we were comfortable with
- ➤ E&S appraisal to include additional points of attention (e.g. PR4: workers health and safety/Covid19 exposure, PR2: risk of redundancy/salary cuts)
- During Covid19 context, E&S appraisal approach for CatB to be defined case by case, depending on client/project scope/country specific travel restrictions/project timeline
- Site visits are difficult to organise for now: when international travel resumes, it is expected that significant effort on visiting sites will be needed (reinforcement of monitoring visits and possible readjustments of ESAP)
- > EBRD actions:
 - Need of capacity building for local consultants

GCAP Pristina: Engaging Online



Stakeholder engagement is a key pillar in producing a meaningful Green City Action Plan (GCAP) that will guide the city's investments and policy reforms

- Pristina first city to undertake stakeholder consultation in the covidsetting
- A new approach for engagement overall
- Not simply a virtual substitution of face-to-face workshops
 - half-day event
 - 100 slides
 - break-out groups
 - coffee-breaks

- ✓ Max. 2 hours session
- ✓ Smaller groups (even if event needs to be repeated)
- ✓ Pre-webinar homework
- ✓ Language
- ✓ Interactive tools

Pros and Cons of Online Webinars



Due to the **COVID-19 pandemic**, we had to find new innovative ways to proceed while respecting EBRD's new strict conditions for stakeholder engagement on their projects.

Pros



- Decrease in some direct costs
- No geographic limitations
- More flexibility for participants
- ✓ More focused engagement
- ✓ Less Covid-19 direct transmission risk

Cons




- Lack of interaction and networking
- Limited time availability
- Lack of control of audience
- Technical issues
- Cannot be used everywhere






